- Raising awareness of non-stereotypical practices.
- Improving staff and parent's knowledge and understanding of issues relating to equality and inclusion.
- Providing access to equal opportunity and inclusion training for staff, and students where appropriate.
- Promoting inclusion throughout all aspects of the Early Years Foundation Stage Guidance (2012).
- Expecting all staff to challenge language, actions, behaviours and attitudes, reporting any occurrences to the Nursery Manager or Deputy.
- Review and reflect on practices, and instigating any changes that are necessary.

Environment

Children are encouraged to empathise with others as this helps the development of critical thinking and will enable them to be able to develop an understanding and appreciation of others.

We strive to provide wide ranging resources that reflect the different cultures, family groupings and abilities in today's society. Positive role modelling through toys, imaginary play and activities that promote non-stereotyped images are encouraged. Children are given opportunities throughout the day to discuss stories and events about their everyday life, families and friends.



Admissions

Wherever possible children who are disabled, disadvantaged or have a specific need will be considered for a place, taking into account their individual circumstances and the ability of the nursery to provide the necessary standard of care.
